3. Apply <u>BEFORE</u> deadline date to Post Secondary Institutions and for Entrance Scholarships!

Do not forget to add your PSI schools to your Student Transcript Service (STS). All students need to complete the STS by mid April in order to have their interim transcript automatically sent to their selected post secondary institutions and organizations. In July, final transcript will be sent.

4. Self-Reporting Marks... Check PSI for Deadline Date and webinar on How to Self-Report. If required... Student must self-report their interim/final grade 11 and 12 marks through the PSI online account. Once logged, student will be able to check the status of their application and self-report their grades.

Please Note:

All self-reported grades are subject to verification.

Distance/Online Courses—must be 50% or more completed and you must finish by May

5. Conditional Offers of Admission

If you meet all of the admission requirements for you program, you may be eligible to receive an early conditional offer of admission

6. Pay Registration Fee by Deadline and Select Courses.

BC Excellence Scholarships - 1 student selected per school. Deadline November 30, 2025


District / Authority Scholarships - Online Application, chosen at the school level. Deadline April 19, 2026




